On Wednesday, the NBS guest speaker will be Nevada's current Secretary of State, Ross Miller. The Las Vegas born, and Carson City raised Miller is no stranger to the world of politics. His father, Bob Miller, is a former Governor of the Silver State.

Miller has held many positions in the state. The first title Miller was elected to was Deputy District Attorney in his home county. During his D.A. tenure, Miller worked to prosecute thousands of murder, sexual assault, robbery, drug trafficking cases-just to name a few.


